Rothe House & Garden – a 17th century Irish merchant's townhouse & garden, in the heart of Kilkenny city – contains a museum, garden and family history centre. There is also a book and gift shop, and the house is the home of the Kilkenny Archaeological Society.

With a costume gallery, portraits, and a fascinating collection of local artefacts, we are delighted to welcome visitors throughout the year, providing a guided tour for groups who book in advance. A café will open to the public during the summer of 2013.

The reconstructed garden (opened in 2008) has two walled areas, with vegetables, fruit trees, herbs and shrubs – all authentic planting of the 17th century.
